Introduction on Knowledge Management



IFAD started with the interest of Knowledge management and sharing of knowledge since 2009 with two phases of KariaNet project, which KariaNet is a regional program that included 10 countries Sudan as one of these countries, so the resulted of KariaNet in the following:

- Create knowledge sharing sites on the Kenana Online portal.
 - Training in various knowledge management tools.
 - Holding an exhibition to share knowledge.
- Knowledge management has been included in the previous country strategy
 due to the importance of producing and sharing knowledge, lessons learned,
 success stories, good practices and learning Route, and this effort resulted
 in the formation of a knowledge management group, as follows.

Knowledge Management (KM) Core Group



- KM Core Group: include ICO staff, CCU-KM Officer, project KM focal points (M&E officer + Community Development), KM focal points from key line Ministries.
 - CCU: has potential to serve as knowledge hub for KM, keep record and institutional memory of KM-activities in Sudan, coordinate joint knowledge sharing activities, share knowledge to federal Ministries and other partners.
 - Coordination with projects to implementation of KM-activities, collection of data, production and dissemination of knowledge products among the communities, states, localities.

The main activities achieved by KM Group



- Organized the first learning Route in Sudan for all projects facilitated by Procasur Corporation.
 - Organized a learning Route for Butana Integrated Rural Development Project(BIRDP) to disseminate successful experiences, knowledge and their applicability to other regions.
- Design the website to disseminate knowledge, lessons learned and all the documentation for all projects (<u>www.ccuifad.sd</u>).
- Training on Gender Action Learning System (GALS) Five of each project were trained To train
 communities on this methodology.
- Participated in the exhibition of the Ministry of Agriculture (Under the theme of: Agriculture is the driver of economic growth).
 - Participated in the World Food Day annually, organize by Ministry of Agriculture and Natural Resources.

The Activities achieved in 2019 by Projects: Livestock Marketing & Resilience Programme(LMRP)



- Produced three Films (livestock value chains, Land Use Workshop and Beat change).
 - Training the targeting communities of Blue Nile State on (GALS) methodology.
- A team from the Native Administration, Development Committee and Conflict Resolution Committee
 of White Nile State visited the Rahd Conflict Resolution Center, Range Administration, Livestock
 Routes and Rainy Season grazing Site in North Kordofan State to know the mechanisms used to
 reduce the conflicts between Pastoralists and farmers.
 - Exchange visit Between (LAT) Livestock Advisory Team and (GEDO) Group Enterprise
 Development Officer, To Visit BIRD Project To benefit from their experiences in the field of livestock business, rural development and rural finance.
 - Learning Route for natural resource management in Kenya facilitated by Procasur Corporation.

The Activities achieved in 2019 by Projects: Integrated Agriculture and Marketing Project



- Appoint a knowledge management consultant for the project.
 - Prepared a knowledge management strategy.
- develop a knowledge management action plan for 2020 including:
 - Training in knowledge production.
