This document explains the process followed by staff involved in MEL workflow. It should be considered an annex to the Information Products Guidelines

(https://hdl.handle.net/20.500.11766/7815) and will be included in a revised version of these guidelines. MEL is also releasing an automated notification to all co-authors (and uploader) recorded in MEL as active users. The notification will return the external link and/or the internal link to MEL. Internal links are accessible only to MEL user and download only allowed to the uploader and co-authors when limited access. Internal link do not have any use when shared with non-MEL users and/or added in other reports (e.g. Donor reports).

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- 1. The publication's online/printed dates are added.
- 2. The title is matched with the title in the uploaded publication.
- 3. The title has capitalization of each letter only when the title of the publication is all in capital letters.
- 4. The correct type of publication is selected.
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- 6. All the publications' authors are added to the metadata and entered in the same sequence.
- 7. The final version of the uploaded file is PDF. It is possible to upload the word file first and then re-upload the PDF version.
- 8. The keywords as it is mentioned in the publication. If not, it is recommended to add AGROVOC² keywords whenever possible. Each publication should have at least 2-3 keywords.
- 9. The abstract is added as it is written in the original publication or a clear and precise summary should be available when the abstract is missing.
