

2019-2020 KM ACTIVITIES (Sudan) **Dissemination & Media:**


Challenges in dissemination activities post LRs:

difficulties to reach other rural areas, lack of knowledge about effective mechanisms to develop dissemination products; the technical difficulty to develop medium-term dissemination products



2023: Local champions web catalogue

- Local champions are men and women with outstanding capabilities, skills, relevant knowledge, and experience who are leading actions, ideas and innovations in rural development areas. They are potential providers of training in rural contexts.

2023: EX POST ASSESSMENT OF THE 3 LRs:

OBJECTIVES:

- Enquire about any <u>knowledge-sharing initiatives</u> that has been organized by participants of the LRs to disseminate key learnings and innovative solutions.
- Assess the perception of the learning acquired during the LR and its <u>utility for the participant</u>.



Assess the <u>replication / adoption / adaptation / scaling</u> up of key learning acquired during the LR and its use and application in the frame of participant's organizations or institutions.

Commitment and ownership of local key actors of LR methodology

i.e. in Sudan value-adding role of the Sourcebook in the context of IFAD's Sudan KM Strategies : in 2022 was updated from the 2017 version using elements of the Sourcebook.

Strengthened capacities of Resource Persons and local institutions

i.e. in Sudan IFAD country teams and technical staff, University of Khartoum, Agricultural Research Council.







KMACTIVITIES -RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Implementation of learning routes with the participation and exposure of farmers;
- Incorporation and development of Innovation Plans, as a scaling up tool and ex-post engagement;
- Identification, validation and exposure of local champions who live in the countryside and who develop agricultural solutions, to avoid the devaluation of nonacademic knowledge that is built and strengthened in rural contexts.
