# Women's Household Agricultural Production Systems Survey Results

The thirteen attached tables were assembled from the analyzed data of a formal survey of rural women. The survey of seventy-two households, from three locations in Baluchistan, was conducted in June and July, 1987. The three locations are presented in Table A and in Fig. 1.

The above three locations were chosen for the survey because present MART/AZRI agronomy, livestock and farming systems research is being conducted in these areas.

The survey was coordinated by the socio-economics /farming systems section and assisted by the agronomy, livestock and extension sections of MART/AZRI. The survey was conducted under contract by Dr. Del Castillo, an anthropologist from the USA, who was assisted by the Sociology Department, University of Baluchistan. The tables were assembled by the socio-economics/farming systems section using the SPSS/PC+ package.


